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## **Cleveland Economic Impact: 2014**



The Cleveland Industrial Retention Initiative (CIRI) is a program of the City of Cleveland, managed by WIRE-Net. CIRI assists the city's manufacturing firms to improve operations, maintain profitability, and remain competitive. CIRI provides local companies with information and support including financing; general business assistance (e.g. business to business connections, sales development, etc.); real estate (site selection) & land assembly; employment & training; infrastructure, technology & modernization; building permits & zoning; safety & security; marketing; and waste management & environmental compliance.

In 2014 the team of five CIRI Industrial Development Managers

- Delivered in-plant support to 510 unique Cleveland manufacturing firms employing 18,100 people
- Conducted 550 total visits to uncover opportunities and challenges at Cleveland's industrial companies (includes follow-up visits)
- Completed 430 services primarily in the areas of general business assistance (includes operational cost savings, utility assistance, and marketing & sales diversification) real estate, infrastructure, and safety & security
- Posted more than 1,100,000 sq. ft. of real estate to Ohio
   One in order to help companies purchase, sell, or lease
   available space and ultimately retain Cleveland businesses
- Delivered service interventions to 15 firms that met one
  of these criteria: new jobs could be added, jobs were at
  risk, costs were reduced, or investment was made
  impacting:
  - 1. 974 direct manufacturing and related jobs
  - 2. \$42 million annual payroll plus \$308,000 in potentially new payroll associated with job creation\*
  - 3. \$840,000 in annual payroll taxes paid to the City
  - 4. \$6 million in retained sales
  - 5. More than \$79,000 in cost reductions\*\*
  - 6. More than \$3.3 million in investment
- \* Payroll is estimated based on payroll data from the State of Ohio Labor Market Information System.
- \*\* Cost Reductions include reduction in operation cost associated with supply purchases, shipping, security, and energy management.
